Summary Of Questions/Comments

Navigation Center

- What is the Navigation Center? What is the update on the new navigation center?
- How can I support the Navigation Center? How can the Faith community support?
- Is counseling and support included in this model?
- Crucial components of a Navigation Center: location, tailored to current and long-term needs
- Why only 4-6 people? -> Size and funding. Today, 10-13 people access daily services each day. We are a wealthy enough community; we should be acting.



- Staying focused on Option 4 (a pilot navigation center) will allow us to make progress on a project. Not having clarity and focus on what we are working for creates obstacles in completing this task.
- A Pilot is better than nothing
- Based on pilot models, are there viable location options? -> Need community input to determine acceptable site.
- Fourth option 1,500 sq. foot, 4-6 people overnight capacity <u>more</u> could access day services. 55 people accessed shelter in 2023 15 beds.

Short-Term Solution for This Winter

- What are we going to do this winter to provide for our homeless?
- Can we use current space this winter Joseph Center? Conference room? We don't have an operator for this model. Of the operators that have been engaged in these discussions their feedback was this model is not sustainable to operate.
- Can we start "lighter" showers, mailing address, phone bank, lockers, trailer with a heater, until we have funds to build a facility?
- TFHD fund modulars? -> Would need to fit within vision, mission and a discussion. Challenges with sanitation, power, permitting during past TTHAC exploration of this type of model
- Truckee needs a 2025/26 winter solution


General Comments

- When are we are going to hear about the Action?
- What is the next critical decision?
- [Unhoused] people are being encouraged to go to Grass Valley/Reno. It is discouraging to access services. Some unhoused people are "working the system"
- How do we support people who need immediate services and those that need pathways to housing?
- Storytelling: important to all the community vs. just this room
- Tailored: not one size or service model fits all needs. Services must be adaptable to meet people where they are and build trust and engagement with services.
- Services must be accessible to county support services in East County
- Where does the funding come from given there is not dedicated funding stream for sheltering services?
- Feedback on possible Locations: Library, Coldstream neighborhood, churches

Table Discussion Summary Notes

Group 1 Notes from Discussion:

What does success look like?

- A place where people have access to their own space and can work with a case manager
- A program which is comprehensive and addresses many needs
- Functional zero (we end homelessness)
- A tailored approach that can support the variety of needs of our unhoused
- A system which doesn't let people down / doesn't discourage the unhoused from trying
- Flexible shelter options to enable proof of concept, can we explore modular units on TTAD lots as a pilot

What additional factors should be considered?

- Transportation / proximity to services
- Temporary shelter (modular / pallet shelter) on lot at Joseph Center as a pilot to evaluate success (2-3 years).
- Funding for interim housing
- · This is an investment in our community
- Prevention is key

Additional comments / questions?

- Sustainable funding is key to all of this
- How can TFHD and airport district support more?
- A pilot program will help our community become more comfortable with this service model.
- This is a complex problem with a complex solution

Group 2 Notes from Discussion

What does success look like?

- Unhoused, access services and interim bed and go forward make possible
- Trackable outcomes fewer interactions with hospital and police



- Bolster community support through a pilot
- What this could be with dignity and design pilot to see success! To be part of solutions, proof of concept.

Additional comments / questions?

- Staffing issue 2 people minimum, 1 professional
- Pilot program one year by winter better than nothing
 - Maybe more people need jobs
 - How many people don't want help?
 - Location brainstorm:
- Location ideas:
- Empty church, library, empty lots at Coldstream, Park and Rec Community Center (downtown), Vets Hall,
- Gateway neighborhood coordination will be needed if this location is considered

Group 3 Notes from Discussion

What does success look like?

- Minimum winter solution vs. long-term solution
 - 15 cots
 - Safe access
 - Food, lockers, restrooms, tracks outcomes
 - Keep people out of the elements
 - Staff
 - Central location to core services

What additional factors should be considered?

- Substance dependency on sober living considerations
- Duration length of stay / weather dependent
- More options for winter / flexible

Additional comments or questions

Year-round solution should be goal -> realize this won't happen for this winter



- Prioritize this winter solution
- Pilot year-round
- Navigation Center
- County space works well

Group 4 Notes from Discussion

What does success look like?

- Case management services, more staff in behavioral health, and more wraparound services
- Timely services for support, consistency of services
- Dignity
- Navigation Center
- Mental health services and access to care (low cost)
- Town buy-in / support
- County services are located down the hill and not in the region
- Funding

What additional factors should be considered?

- Substance use services needed (locally)
- · Increased hospital needs in winter vs. summer
- Transportation
- Utilizing TART
- Regionality
- Land use issues

Other comments, questions?

- Explore converted cargo facility
- Interim facility
- · Portable units at different locations
- Lack of other jurisdictional infrastructure
- What happened with Home Key + grant (for the 1 unidentified location in Truckee)?



- How much money is available right now?
- Open restroom facilities at railyard for over night use (or put in porta-potties and dumpster)
- Location: Old Sierra Sun building behind Taco Bell

Group 5 Notes from Discussion

- Possible locations
 - State Park with mobile homes
 - Joseph Center
 - Library
 - Gateway Church
 - Private land
 - Transit Center by TAL (no neighbors)
 - Park on West River St

What does success look like?

- Funding, staffing, location
- Smallest scale services without physical location, however, there is no property and land
- Need minimal services -> e.g. bank of lockers (program in San Diego)
- Community engagement like this

What additional factors should be considered?

- Focus first on the outcome—what is the outcome we want to achieve? Build to this.
- Economies of scale—an issue here, we are small, hard to compete for funding with other urban areas
- Starting with solutions, rather than problem + outcome
- PSH (permanent supportive housing) has better outcomes with health and funding
- Trailers and mobile homes should be considered (who will monitor this)
- Temporary winter solutions
- Focus on window of opportunity -> close connection to services
- Getting stuck in planning/surveys than action and trying things
- Ensure we're building trust



Additional comments? Questions?

- Location is the sticking point of progress even without a perfect location
- How to lean into churches
- Cost per bed night -> why does this not shift?
- Exploring non-congregate shelters (e.g. motels, hotels) -> open motels at night
- Is Navigation Center the best solution for this economy of scale?
- How does this interact with STRs, AirBnbs?
- Homeless experiences is not a monolith everyone has their own needs tailored solutions

Funding options and ideas to explore:

- TFHD, unique funding model
- Staffing ideas
 - hybrid with volunteers, small stipends or other incentives
 - Folks with lived experience
 - Staffing with County employees are expensive
 - AMI Housing
 - The Gathering inn -> Placer County partners
- What is our care coordination team? Creating coalition
 - No dedicated County homelessness fund
- Town Council gave direction re: Navigation Center based on community feedback
 - Navigation Center was a response to scattered site housing and lack of supportive services. Scattered sites had safety concerns
 - Warming shelter
- Navigation Center is more expensive than scattered site

What does success look like?

- Have core nonprofit with sustainable funding
- Identifying a location for any type of services



Staying focused on option 4

What additional factors should be considered?

- Understanding Town's long-term commitment
- Core nonprofit to run / support
- Exploring broader regional partners (e.g. AMI)
