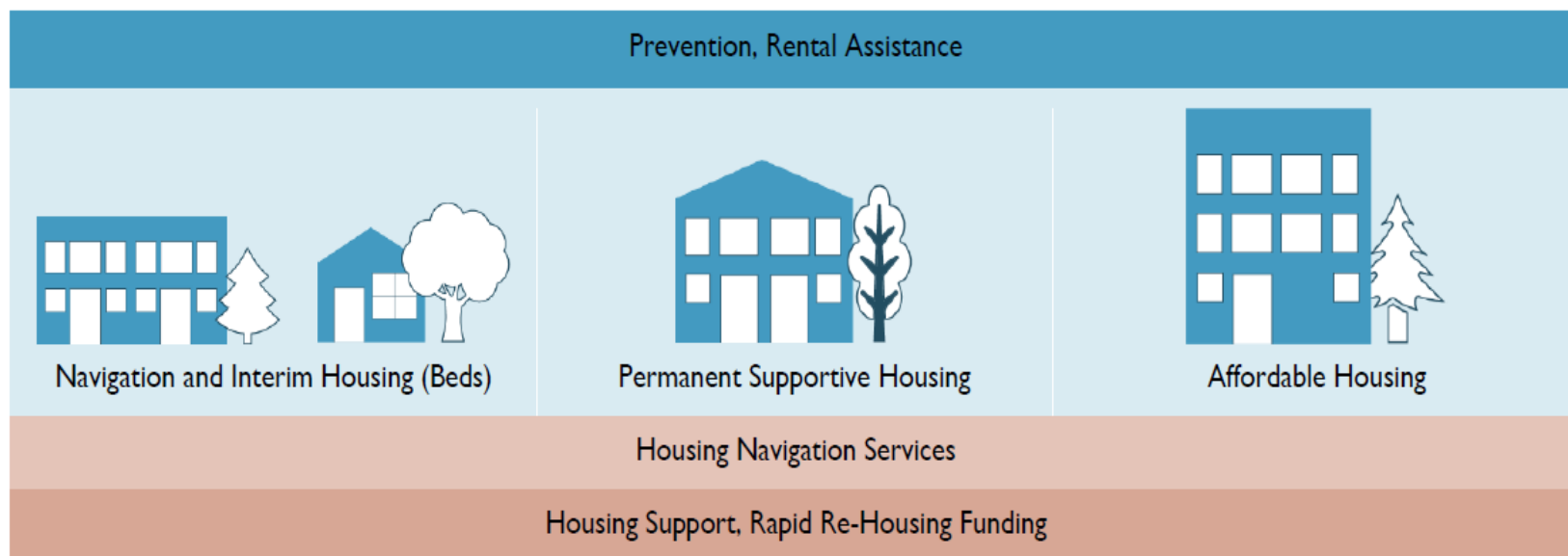

Truckee Police Updates

Navigation Center Pilot Success Statement:

After one year, the Navigation Center demonstrates improved housing pathways, reduced crisis system use, positive neighborhood impact, and a financially viable model ready for continuation or scale.

Navigation Center

- Volunteers of America is responsible for all daily operations of the Center.
- The Center will be open 3 hours per day for day 5 days/week for Day Center Services
- 16 bed shelter 24/7
- The facility is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week, with a nighttime curfew from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- Services will be guest-centered and includes:
 - Shelter
 - Case management
 - Connection to financial and non-financial resources
 - Medical and behavioral health services
 - Alcohol and drug treatment referrals
 - Employment and housing support
 - General life skills support as needed
- The site is restricted to guests, service providers, and staff
- Drug and alcohol use or sales are strictly prohibited on or around the Center property.

Unduplicated overnight guests (total unique individuals)

- 47 individuals
 - 35/47 Nevada County
 - 74.5%
 - 07/47 Placer County
 - 14.9%
 - 05/47 Other
 - 10.6%

Total overnight guests, including duplicates*

- 75 individuals
 - 51/75 Nevada County
 - 68.0%
 - 16/75 Placer County
 - 20.89%
 - 08/75 Other
 - 10.7%

duplicates refer to individuals who have exited and returned to the navigation center after any period of time away

Bed Utilization

- Interim housing (*6 beds*)
 - 96.0% utilization
 - 100% in last 4 weeks
- Emergency Shelter (*10 beds*)
 - 91.9% utilization
 - 96.8% in last 4 weeks
- Combined (*16 beds*)
 - 93.4% utilization
 - 98.0% in last 4 weeks

Day Center Utilization (non-residents)

- Total guests served
 - 32
- Total services events (meal, shower, laundry)
 - 204 combined
 - Total meals – 125
 - Total showers – 53
 - Total laundry – 26

Offered Mon-Fri 12-3 pm for all North Lake Tahoe Truckee unhoused individuals not staying at Truckee Navigation Center. Provides access to meals, showers, laundry and case management

Sit-outs

Feb 25 – March 31

- 19 total sit-outs issued
 - 13 individuals receiving sit-outs
 - 6 individuals receiving multiple sit-outs (2 or more)
 - 12/19 sit-outs resulting from curfew violations
 - 7/19 sit-outs resulting from behavior violations

April 1 – April 30

- 13 total sit-outs issued
 - 11 individuals receiving sit-outs
 - 2 individuals receiving multiple sit-outs (2 or more)
 - 9/13 resulting from curfew violations
 - 4/13 resulting from behavior violations

May 1 – May 31

- 4 total sit-outs issued
 - 4 individuals receiving sit-outs
 - 0 individuals receiving multiple sit-outs (2 or more)
 - 1 / 4 resulting from curfew violations
 - 3 / 4 resulting from behavior violations

Measures of Success:

In November 2025 TTHAC provided direction to collect data across several key areas:

- Housing transitions
- Service engagement
- Health and safety outcomes
- Community feedback
- Long-term funding sustainability

These metrics are included in the revenue agreements with the funding partners and included in VOA's contract

Measures of Success:

Housing and Stability

- # of people moved from homelessness to permanent or longer-term housing
 - Too early to measure
- # and % of participants coming back into the shelter
 - Too early to measure
- Average length of stay before transition to stable housing
 - Too early to measure

Measures of Success:

Service Access

- **41** individuals connected to case management and wraparound services, obtaining key benefits (e.g., CalFresh, Medi-Cal, behavioral health)
- **11** of participants connected to employment, training, or income support for housing
- **27** participants completed referrals (medical, behavioral health, recovery, etc.)
- **8** participants are accessing behavioral health or substance use treatment (VOA, Nevada & Placer County)

Measures of Success:

Health and Safety

- # of emergency room visits among participants
 - Reporting TBD (in conjunction with TFHD)
- # of law enforcement contacts/police calls involving unsheltered individuals
 - Reported by Truckee PD
- **8/27** participants accessing behavioral health or substance use treatment (VOA, Nevada & Placer County)
- **24** referrals to primary care and other medical services

Community and Neighborhood Support

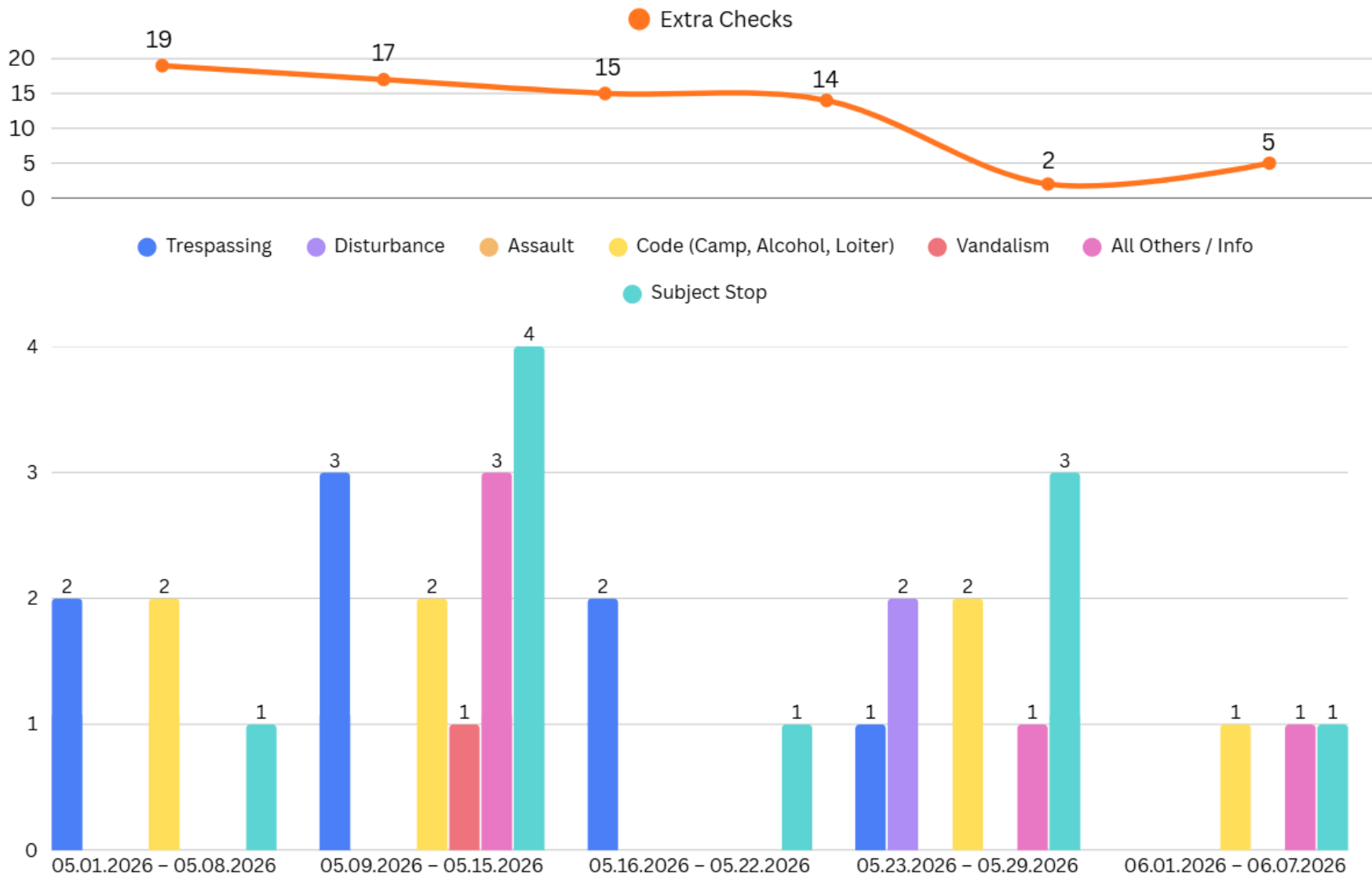
- Measure neighborhood support through HOA managed survey process
 - Reporting TBD
- Volunteers and hours contributed to the Center
 - **4** volunteers completed orientation starting week of 6/8/26

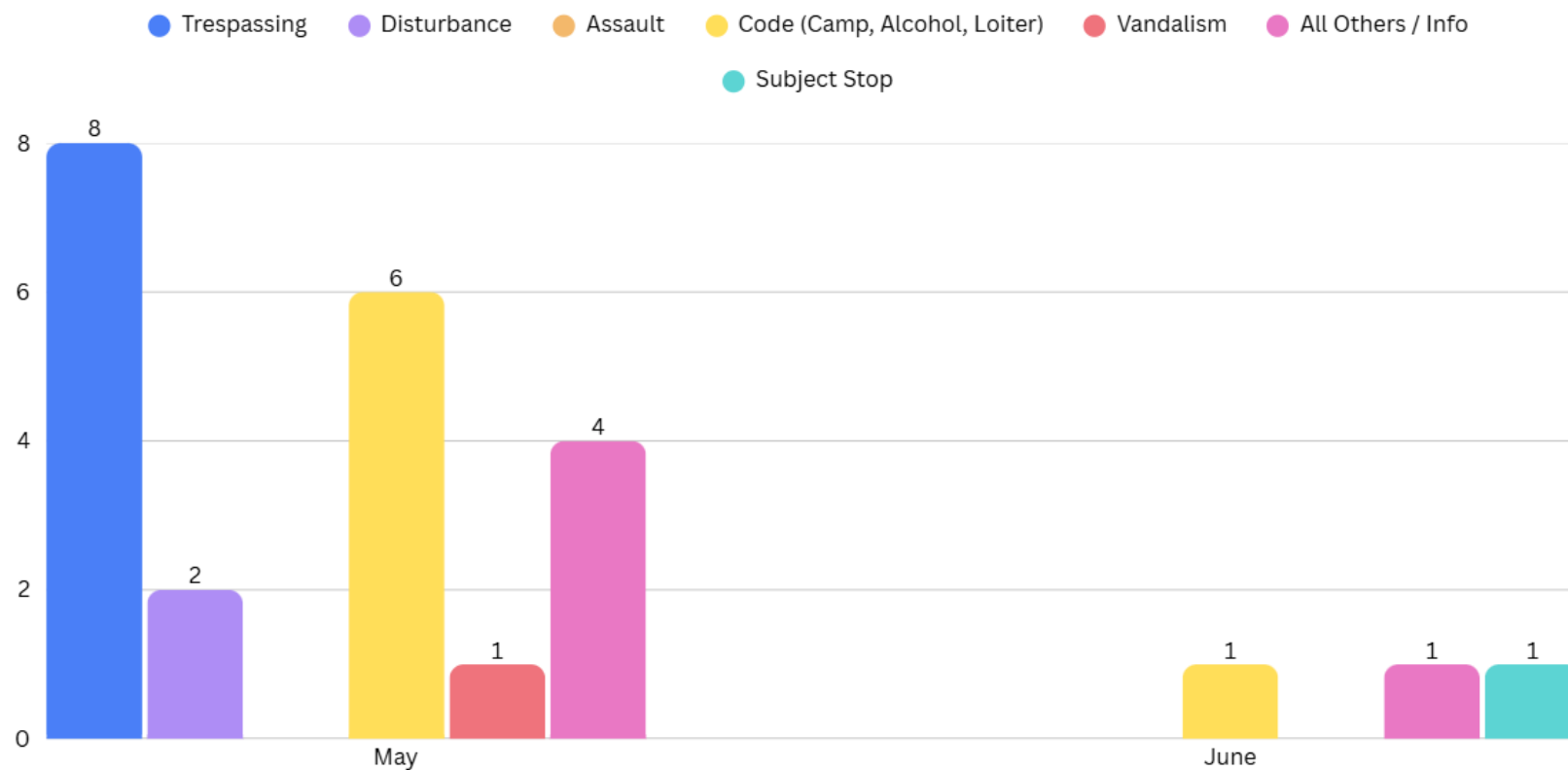
May 1 – June 7, 2026



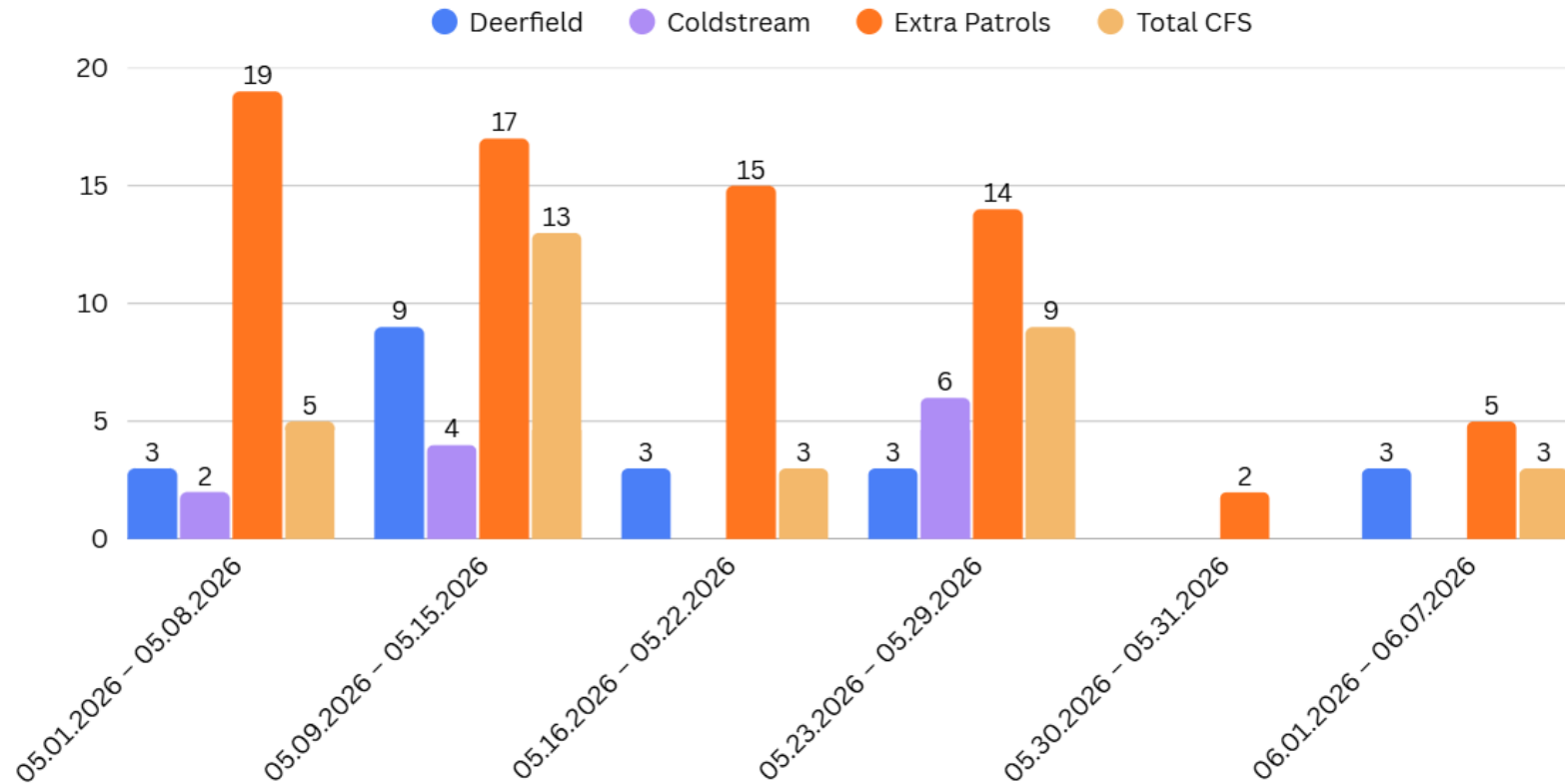
TPD Weekly Call Types



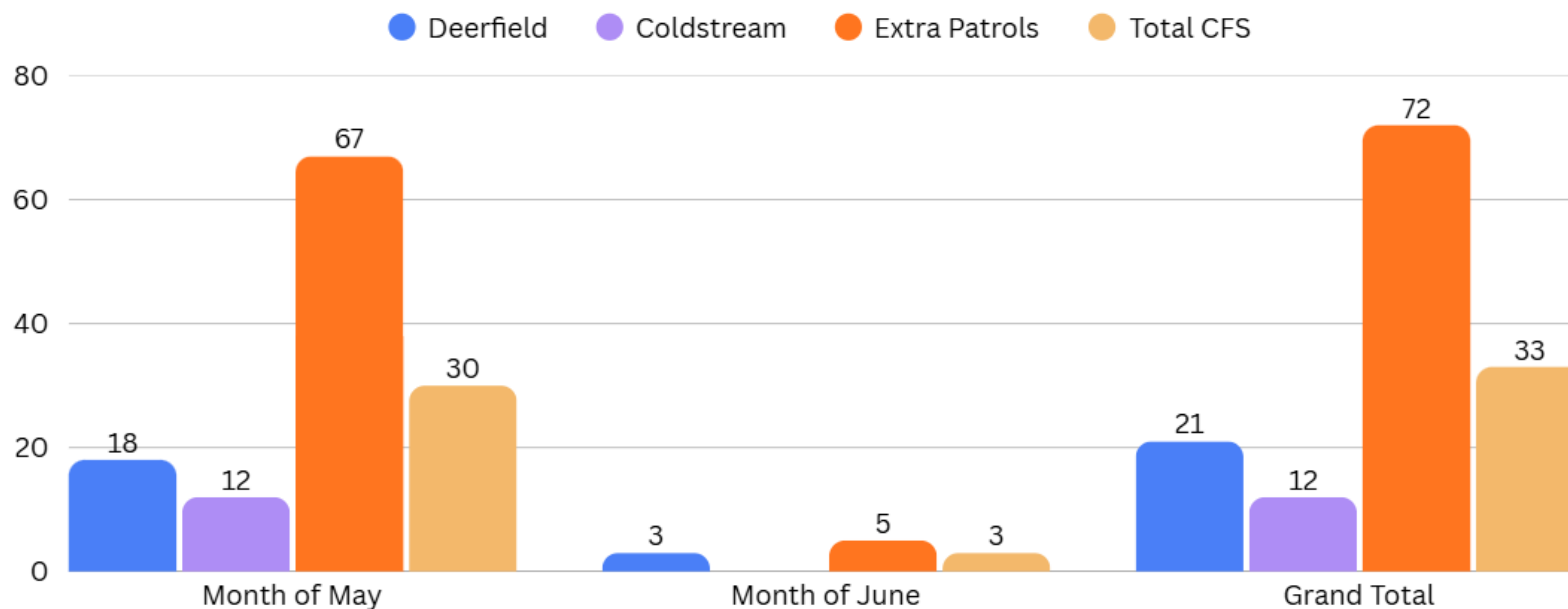
TPD Monthly Call Types



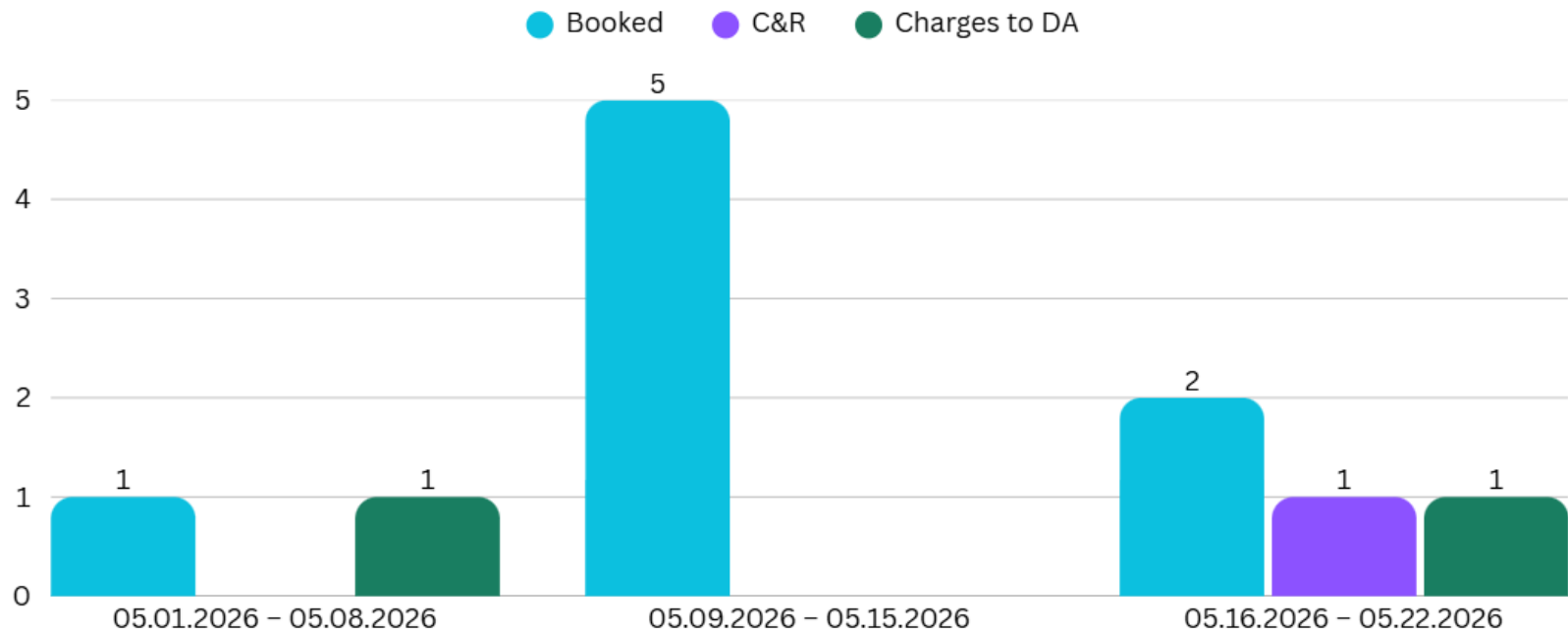
TPD Weekly Calls For Service



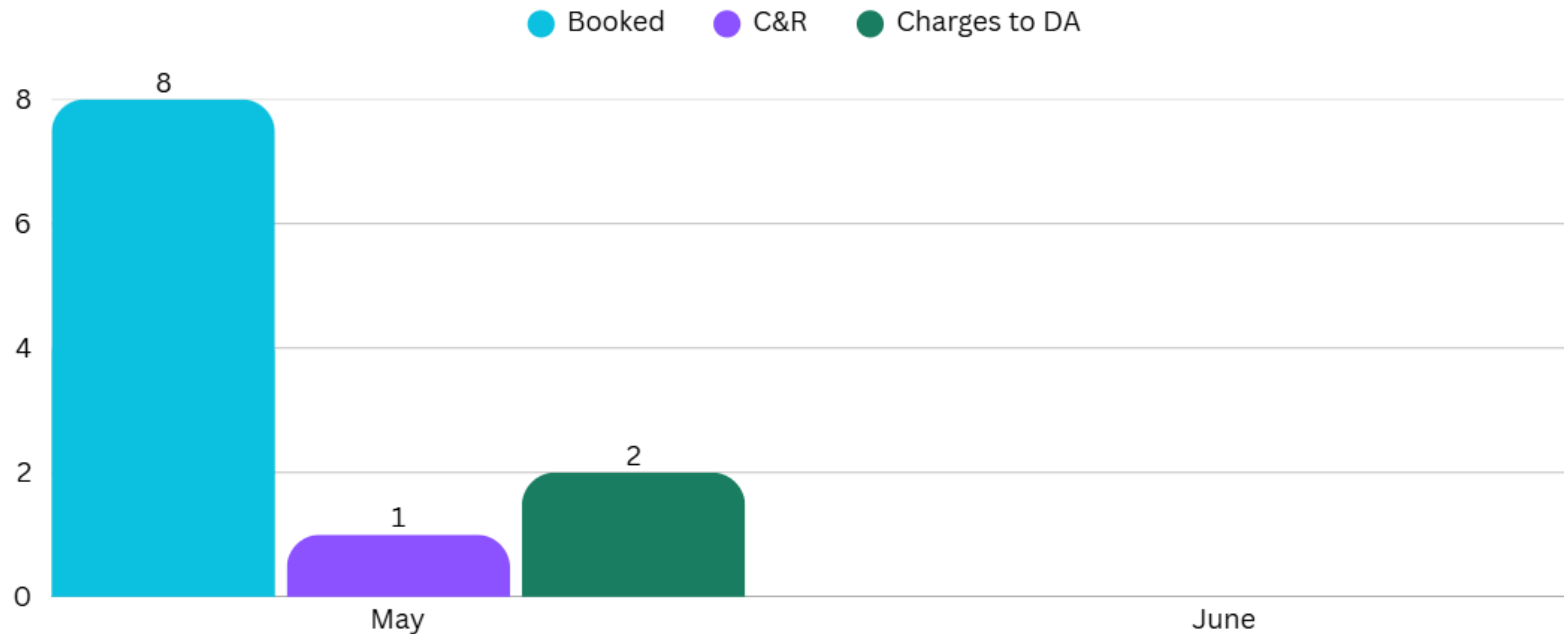
TPD Monthly Calls For Service

TTHAC Discussion: Determining metrics of success

- TTHAC will continue data evaluation of all the metrics available
- This includes:
 - Looking at quantitative data from our systems
 - Truckee PD data review for historical data Coldstream Vs. Town wide calls for service
 - VOA engagement with Coldstream Commons/John Stewart Co
 - HOA communication with Coldstream Commons property management (?)
 - Impacts to TFHD
 - Processes and collaboration in place address issues as they arise

TTHAC Discussion: Pilot to Permanency



- TTHAC makes a recommendation in August/September on pilot success
- CDBG Block grant timeline for funding notification, Fall 26
- Recommendations and funding requests will be presented to the governing boards
- TFHD and Town will scheduling a joint meeting in September
- Town, TFHD, and County boards will vote on funding and support of the project becoming permeant
- Current budget is on track within our projections
